First Sunday of Advent

• Isaiah 63:16b-17, 19b; 64:2-7 • Psalm 80 • 1 Corinthians 1:3-9 • Mark 13:33-37 •

Keep awake. Be alert. These words in today's Gospel are clear and direct. But why are they shared with us at the beginning of the Advent season? A time usually associated with preparing for the Christmas season?

It is this question of readiness that is at the heart of the "reason for the season". If God can break into our lives by taking human form, then the season of Advent can challenge us to be on guard for God's coming – both at Christmas and at the end of time. We must be alert in order to answer the call to discipleship we have received, and be ready to account for our actions and decisions at the last judgement.


As we do not know the time or place, let us approach our Advent prayer as an opportunity to reflect on our readiness, remembering that God is gentle and loving. As we see in the first reading, the people felt God had turned his back on them; yet, when they recalled all that God had done for them, they trusted in God's goodness and saving power. Saint Paul reminds us in the second reading that God is faithful and will strengthen us to the end. So let us rejoice and give thanks for this Advent opportunity to reflect on our lives and God's goodness, and stay awake for his coming.

Advent Penance

This Sunday's first reading from Isaiah reminds us that we might not want to do away altogether with the penance that has been traditionally associated with Advent. This reading gives us a context for such penance: Christ's judgment that will accompany his coming at the end of time. Penance helps us to be mindful of God in our lives and helps us become more pliable so that God, the potter, can truly mold us into God's image and likeness. Advent's penance, then, might be directed toward the discipline of watching for God and being mindful of God at the centre of our lives. For example, we might consciously look at the face of others and see an image of Christ. Or we might take five minutes each day and just stop all our activity to be aware of God's Presence to us. Or we might take the time to read each day the gospel for the next Sunday and begin to see how it motivates right actions for us to choose during each day.
