Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time

• Job 38:1-4, 8-11 • Psalm 107 • 2 Corinthians 5:14-17 • Mark 4:35-41 •

How appropriate is the Gospel reading of today. With the multitude of storms, winds, droughts, floods and fires in the last few years, we can easily cry out with the disciples: "We are perishing."

Yet we know the greatest mistake is to let fear take over our lives, even though we, like the disciples, live with many worries and unanswered questions. We know we must live by faith, which is the ability to trust even when despair knocks at our door, to do justice, even at great cost; to profess a firm love in a God we sometimes cannot find, knowing at the same time that God is always with us and never abandons us.

When the disciples experienced the calm after the sea, and the wind obeyed Jesus' words, they were filled with awe; even though they who had spent so long with Jesus still wondered; "Who can this be?" Sometimes we too continue to ponder this question in our own lives and seek answers as we struggle to live our faith.

Our own experience of awe can be a source of encouragement for us to continue to work for justice to know the hoy and wisdom of helping each other through stormy times, knowing peace is not far behind.

Why are you afraid? Have you still no faith?

We live most of our days on the surface; we tend to take things at face value. It often takes a "storm" to shake us up and make us delve deeper into who we are and where we are going on life's journey. So, too, does the "violent squall" in this Gospel story challenge the disciples to move from their surface understanding of who Jesus is to the deeper faith in Him that discipleship demands. Like the disciples, we must learn to leave the crowd and take Jesus with us in our "boat" – on our life's journey. When violent squalls come up, waves break over our boat, frightening us. Jesus can seem asleep until we cry out to Him. As with the disciples in the gospel story, so it is with us: in the storm of our life, Jesus quiets us and teaches us to "be still" and come to deeper faith in Him.

Nativity of St. John the Baptist, 24th June

On Monday, we celebrate the solemnity of the Nativity of Saint John the Baptist. John the Baptist was the great prophet and herald of Jesus the Messiah. He prepared the way of the Lord and revealed Jesus to others as both the Messiah and the Lamb of God. It is not by coincidence that the birth of John the Baptist falls shortly after the summer solstice, 21st June, while Christ's birth is after winter solstice, 22nd December. In the northern hemisphere, 21st June is the longest day of the year; after that, the days will get shorter and shorter. After the winter solstice, the days will gradually increase in length. Saint Augustine drew a connection between this cosmic pattern and the saint we honour, who said, "He must increase; I must decrease" John 3:30. (LTP 2012)
